The course is an introduction to the scientific field of Clinical Psychology. It presents a modern approach of the intelligence (definition, characteristics, types, tests) and personality assessment. It describes the main theories of personality formation and development (psychodynamic, behavioral, cognitive, humanistic). Also, it focuses on the main principles of psychotherapeutic approaches such as Psychodynamic Therapy, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) and Systemic Therapy. Clinical cases are presented and students are able to be familiarized with the principles of the psychotherapeutic procedures.
