Texts containing exercises, vocabulary, discussion topics, and audio texts are provided. There is a gradual training of the student in the use, interpretation and presentation of the scientific knowledge of the field of speech and language pathology through short presentations (individual or group) of various scientific papers / writings.

Upon successful completion of the course the student will be able to:

• Understand and use the English terminology of his specialty both in spoken and written language (Levels 1 & 2: Knowledge & Understanding)

- Understand published scientific articles / texts in English concerning the scientific field of speech and language pathology (Levels 1 & 2: Knowledge & Understanding)
- Translate and summarize scientific articles / texts in the field of speech and language pathology from English to Greek and vice versa (Level 3: Implementation)
- Make short individual group presentations in English with topics related to the scientific field of speech and language pathology (Levels 4, 5, 6: Analysis, Synthesis & Evaluation)
